The beauty of sainthood is irrefutable. W.B. Yeats said, "You can refute

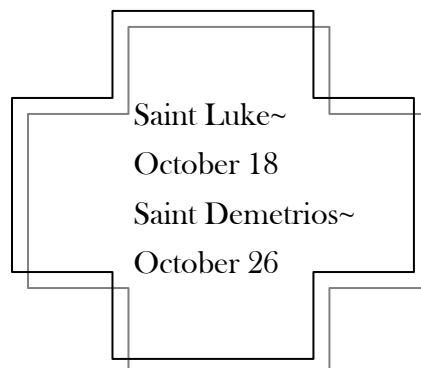
Hegel but not a saint." No one can refute the powerful argument of a changed life.

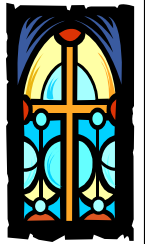

Albania

Can you imagine staying for two weeks in a tiny village on the side of a mountain in Albania with no internet, no phone, nor the beach? It sounded like complete torture when my dad told my sisters and I that we were going to visit the village that his grandfather (Aristidis Mpoudalis) immigrated from 100 years ago. Earlier in the year he said we were going to Greece this summer, so I had pictured myself swimming in the clear waters on an island somewhere and coming back with the perfect Grecian tan. That's not exactly what I got out of this trip. What I got was even better, a chance to finally meet my cousins and family members that I have never met nor even talked to before. Who knew there could be so many Bontales' in one village? My two sisters, my parents, Yiayia, my Aunt Irene, and myself traveled the eight hours by plane and 6 hours by car to the tiny village of Boulouratis where we would stay for two weeks to celebrate Panayias and to meet my family.

So many thoughts ran through my head as we drove up the dirt road in the village up to my Theo Alki's house. "What if they don't like me, what if I don't like their food, no Facebook, and OH MY GOSH I DON'T SPEAK GREEK?" When we pulled up to my Theo Alki's house we were greeted by the dozens of cousins as if Steve the prodigal son had finally returned. Throughout my trip I learned about their persecution and how they survived. They told me what they went through when they were under occupation and their lifestyle and hardships at that time. Their stories really had an impact on me and I have really come to appreciate everything that my ancestors did to escape and come to America for us to live freely.

During my two weeks in the village, I danced Epirotiko; I laughed, ate WAY too much, and grew closer to my family. I would like to thank my dad for bringing us back to Boulouratis to meet my family. It really was an amazing trip!
