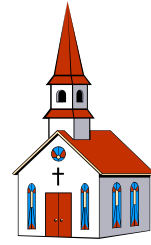

From Father George

Friends of Kimisis:

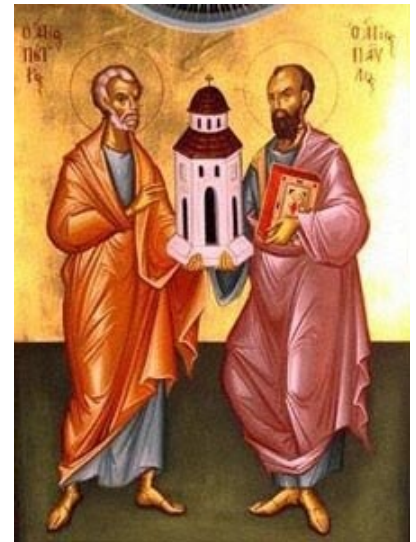
After his conversion from being a persecutor of Christians, St. Paul became, in heart and soul, a zealous and courageous apostle of Christ. "Paul was a wolf," says St. Chrysostom, "but he became a lamb. He was a thorn, but he became a fruitful vine. From an enemy, he became a friend; from a weed, he became wholesome bread...The blasphemer became a theologian; the persecutor, a heard of good news; the tormentor- a leader; the traitor- a fellow champion." (Chrysostom On the Holy Twelve Apostles.)

On the feast of SS. Peter and Paul, St. Ambrose said, "This day brothers, is well known to us and to the whole world. Their feast cannot be confined to one part of the world. St. Augustine, in one of his sermons in their honor says, " Although we know from tradition that they did not die at the same time, nevertheless, we honor the memory of both

on the same day, since St. Paul died a year later on the same day on which Peter was freed from the bonds of the body and was transferred to the worried of the angels." In the Small Vespers we read: "O Peter, foundation of the Apostles, rock of Christian faith, head of the Christians...O Paul, preacher of the gentiles, protector of Christians, lamp of the universe, great voice of Christ, the living God... O Peter, supreme disciple; Paul, the ideal of the Apostles." The stitchers of Great Vesper service extols them with these praises; Terrible swords of the spirit, splendid ornaments of Rome, nourishers of the whole universe; spiritual tablets of the New Testament written by God...founders of the Church, true pillars, foundation and trumpets of the divine teachings of Christ, sharers in His suffering... O Peter, rock and foundation of faith, and Paul, chosen vessel..."

Historical Fact of Saints Peter and Paul:

Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome under Emperor Nero in the year 67 AD. Peter was crucified head down, at his own request, and Paul, in his quality of Roman Citizen, was beheaded. The Church unites them in a common celebration and gave them the identical honor. They are both celebrated on June 29.

Stewardship Report

At the General Assembly on May 10, I reported on the current data on Stewardship for our Church. For those of you who did not attend, here is a summary of the report:

MAY 10 REPORT

As of May 10, we have 307 commitments to our Stewardship program. We are awaiting the responses from 157 stewards from 2010. There are 31 stewards from 2009 who have not yet responded.

If ALL were to make a commitment of any kind, we would have 495 households that support our ministries. To date, we have received **311 pledge commitments** totaling \$148,662.77 with \$107,655.77 donated toward them as of 5/10/11. Our goal for 2011 is \$205,000. We are grateful for the generosity and early commitment by many. We look forward to hearing from our remaining **188 stewards.**

Since January, we have 30 new stewards and 20 stewards have returned from 2009.

For those who attended the **General Assembly**, they became aware of additional expenses due to issues in the Community Center: roof leaks, floor repairs, and the need to replace one of the heat/ac

units. Parishioners also learned of the expenditures associated with planning needs for an additional parking lot on the south side of the property (next to the Church). Our community is growing and it takes several years to create a new lot. Early planning will ensure that the lot will be ready for our use sooner than later.

Please make every effort to attend General Assemblies. They are held twice a year (May and November) with an occasional emergency G.A. when a vote is needed on a pressing matter. Attending these meetings is another form of Stewardship to voice your thoughts and vote on important issues.

CALENDAR YEAR BASIS

Many stewards operate on a different annual cycle than the calendar year. We find that if stewards pledge in September, they pledge again in the following September. That is why the numbers don't match up at this time.

The Stewardship program, like most home and business-based budgets, operates on a **calendar-year basis.** This helps to plan better and to ensure that our operating costs are met in a timely fashion. While Stewardship is about more than treasure (it includes the time and talent of our many parishioners), there is still

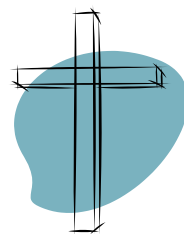
a financial need to fulfill. If at all possible, it would be very helpful if your personal commitment coincided with the calendar-year plan for Stewardship, or at least as early in the year as you can. We have seen that happening already compared with last year and if that continues, we'll see our goal met sooner.

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT FOR GREEK SCHOOL AND DANCE

While it's a little early to think about fall registration for Greek School and Dance classes, this is a reminder to complete your stewardship commitment form (in the KCU, in the Office, online at www.kimisis.com) A commitment is required to register in Greek School and Dance.

which she was slated to graduate this month as a Medical Assistant. She will be granted a posthumous degree along with her graduating class.

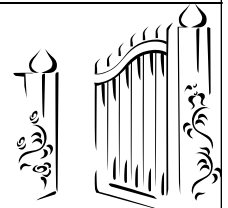

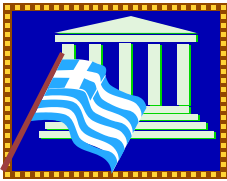

rything running smoothly. The future is safe in their hands.

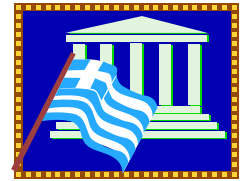
