Dear Parishioners and Friends of Kimisis:

Simeon met Jesus! So can we! Faith is not something we inherit from our families. Faith comes from a personal meeting or encounter with Jesus. We can meet him in prayer each day/ We meet Him in the Bible. We meet Him in every liturgy. We meet Him in the face of every needy person. Simeon held Jesus in his arms. We can picture Jesus holding children in His arms, but here is something totally different: Simeon holds Jesus in his arms! Are we not invited to do the same? Don't we hold Jesus in our mind when we read His Precious words in the Gospel and when we pray to Him? Don't we hold him in our hearts when we receive His precious body and blood in Holy Communion? When this happens, we too can say with Simeon, "Lord, now I've seen everything! Now I can live and die contented! For I have seen the Savior!"

One of the post-communion thanksgiving prayers we recite after receiving Jesus in the Eucharist is the prayer of Simeon. And how very appropriate it is to pray this inspiring prayer at that moment. For, having just received the Savior not just into our arms but into our hearts, we break out in praise and thanksgiving as we say:

Lord now let your servant depart in peace,

According to Your word:

For my eyes have seen your salvation.

Which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples

A light for the revelation to the Gentiles,

And for the glory to your people Israel (Luke 2:29)

Truly we have seen the Light. Let us received Jesus into our hearts. our minds, and our body.



Capital Improvement Fund Appeal for Sound System



The Capital Improvement fund was established as a separate account in order to collect funds necessary to make improvements to our church, community center, and property. The most recent project was the installation of a new sound system for the church, narthex, and church entrance. The cost of this project is approx \$10,500. We are so appreciative to the congregation for their generosity in so many ways. Yet, with this we have another appeal to fulfill.

Yes, the second tray on Sundays does go to the capital improvement fund. This tray usually generates approx. \$200 per week depending on attendance. The cost of the new sound system must be paid in full by our church's annual festival in the spring. As you can see, we cannot depend solely on the tray. We need your help.

Our church is our home, and we are so blessed to be able to congregate each and every week in our most beautiful House of God. The importance of delivering God's message in a clear manner is the reason the Parish Council decided on the new sound system.

Involving Youth in the Music of the Church

"Whoever attunes himself and studies the meaning of sacred songs from beginning to end will find himself approaching God", St. Gregory Palamas, 12th century

As our beloved Greek Orthodox Church in America moves into the future, many questions will be asked:

What will our Divine Liturgy sound like 100 years from now?

Who will be in the choirs?

■How much English will we be using?

Will we have new hymns?

Regardless of the answers to these questions, one concept stands true: for American Orthodoxy to continue successfully into the future, we must hand the liturgical traditions, musical understanding and passion for our faith to our children as our forefathers handed it to us.

As evidenced by the words of St. Gregory Palamas above, the heart of the Orthodox Church lies within its hymnology. The great teachings of our faith can be found within the songs of praise that we have sung for centuries. What better way to guide our children into living Christ-centered lives than through singing the hymns of the Church?

The purpose of the Angel Choirs is to glorify God through song while promoting a lifetime love of music, through the gift of the Holy Spirit. We will strive for excellence in singing and understanding the rich musical heritage of the Greek Orthodox Church. Each Sunday the Angel Choir will sit up in our Choir loft with Adult/GOYAN Choir and sing any part of the Liturgy that they know along with the Adult/GOYAN Choir and will go to Sunday School during communion. Some hymns will be sung by the Angel Choir alone once they have rehearsed them.

Our choir is a member of the Eastern Federation of Greek Orthodox Church Musicians. Many members participate in the annual conference and workshops. Our New Jersey district is also very active in the annual Holy Cross Celebration in Asbury Park, a Christmas Concert in a different parish each year, and a Lenten Musical Offering (concert) held each year on the Friday before Holy Week in various parishes. These extra activities are on a volunteer basis.
