



PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

Dear Family of Kimisis Tis Theotokou,



I would like to thank my predecessor Robert Bucco Jr. for his three years of service to our Church. I would also like to thank the out-going Parish Council member Steve Bontales who has served our Parish with hard work, passion and enthusiasm for over fifteen years. At the same time, I welcome the two new members, Parry Peters and Tom Protentis.

My vision as President is to grow our Community in an environment of respect, harmony, fellowship and financial stability. In order to achieve this, I believe if we have Love (Agapi) as our driving force we will be propelled to successful outcomes. I would implore that we engrave upon our hearts 1 Corinthians 13, especially verses 4-7: "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres."

My mission, with the collaboration of the Parish Council and all the Parishioners, is to substantially improve our finances. Assuming no crisis, we only have 3 weeks of cash reserves on hand to pay our bills. In order to continue to maintain our Church and the services it provides to our Community, we need to increase our revenue and cash reserves to at least 2 months.

Stewardship last year contributed to less than 50% of our revenue. We do need to improve that percentage. According to the Archdiocese Finance Committee, Stewardship should be at an average of 70% to 80% of a Parish's revenue. The cost of maintaining our Church is \$1,100 per day. If every Parishioner set aside \$2 per day (less than a cup of coffee at Starbucks) for Stewardship, our revenues will increase from less than 50% to 60% and give us some breathing space. Knowing those numbers and their critical impact, I am sure we can all work together to achieve this Goal. Again, I turn to Apostle Paul, who in his second letter to the Corinthians, Chapter9 advised, "...he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully... for God loves a cheerful giver..."

Regarding activities within our Community, Congratulations to the Kimisis Junior Basketball Team and their Coaches for winning the NJ District II Championship and completing an undefeated season of 7-0.

The Parish Council currently needs to raise funds to support the following capital expenses in the Community Center:

- 1) Repair Flashing on Fascia
- 2) New Gutters-Approximate cost \$9,000.
- 3) Curtains for the Stage to allow Sunday School to conduct classes-Cost to be Determined.

Your tax deductible donations towards any of these important projects will be greatly appreciated.

I will also kindly ask you, if you have not already pledged for 2013, to please join our list of Stewards by contacting Helen Antholis, or our Church secretary Frieda Mookas.

Before closing, I'd like to remind everyone to keep Fr. George in their prayers. We miss him and ask God to bless him and grant him a speedy recovery.

Guest Stewardship Article from: Josephine Michael Tsarnas The Gospel Reading Matthew Chapter 25:14-30 this master gives three of his servants what it says in the Bible - <u>talents</u>!

o follow the example in this gospel, let's say your boss gives you an extra task by giving you talents and says to you, "I want you to do something with it, grow it and to do good things with it, because when I come back I expect it to be even greater – to grow more."

Well, everyone is different and have their ways, their interests, talents and desires! Some have greater abilities to do things in their life, some have less. Whether we are given from the master; 5 talents or 2 or just 1! Our abilities, our time, our energy; all of it, is of great value! The point in this gospel reading; is no matter who we are, whether we are extremely wealthy in terms of our time, talent or treasure or whether we have a humble life and we are in society not seen as having a lot - it does not matter! Because all of it, is of great value to God! When we think about ourselves, our life and we apply it to the gospel reading; it is our role as Christians' and as a member of the Church. God expects us to use this great treasure He has given us, in a way to make it greater than he gave it to us!

There are individuals' who accept the responsibility to help carry and help their fellow human beings, putting their own lives in danger. We know that our lives are not meant only for ourselves. It is when we help our neighbor that we feel an overwhelming sense of completion. When we help our brothers and sisters, we fulfill the second part of the greatest commandment.

He gave us the wisdom and strength, not only be good stewards to our fellow Orthodox Christians, but also to be protectors for every person we encounter so that all can be lifted above pain, sorrow or suffering so we can help those who are less fortunate than we are in order to serve God and grow the Church!

If you have a gift, or calling no matter what it is... it could be a gift of art, photography, teaching, listening to others or the gift of music. Think of Marie Devino, Elia and Argiri, how with their talents lead our music in the

Church. This is merely one example of how to use your talent to build up the Church. If we sit back and think; it will just happen, we will be disappointed. We become disillusioned. We think of things that should be different but we have not moved one inch to make it better!

There is no special talent or capability required to love someone, to embrace someone! Everyone is capable of love! "We can all become stewards right now; I can be more patient, be more gentle, kind, be forbearing, forgiving, not gossip and above all, I can love" and this is what we are called to do! If we do these things we can build up our parish and then we will hear what the master told his servants. "Well done, good and faithful servant."

Philoptochos Perspective By Josephine Michael Tsarnas, President

o Lady Gaga may have nine million followers on twitter. but Jesus Christ has billions throughout the centuries! His Word is our book of twitter. Those of us who are following Him in this world will have our share of troubles but will continue to be of good cheer! Do not dwell on material things in this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind and soul. "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

I recently read an article about a poll taken in Greece to determine how many people believe in God, how many attend church, how many recognize the hymns of Holy Week, but most importantly, how many people attend the service of the Resurrection and how many people actually stay after the lights go out! For those who are familiar, many have a weakness of coming for the light and upon receiving the light, they head for their cars. In

doing so, they miss the entire Divine Liturgy which follows, the most glorious part. And so the poll found that only 13% of all Orthodox Christians in Greece (98% of the population in Greece or 11.5M people) actually stay until the end of the Divine Liturgy of the greatest feast day of the year. The Pascal Divine Liturgy is the primary ecclesiastical of the year.

But there are those of us who care about our Orthodoxy, who are vigilantly learning our faith, actually listening and engaging our faith, not simply saying "we are Orthodox," but attempting to live it. We are all called to receive Holy Communion, those who have fasted and those who have not: those who feel worthy and those who feel they are not worthy. In the Pascal Sermon of St. John Chrysostom from the 4th Century, 1600 years ago, he calls "those who started at the beginning or those who came at the eleventh hour are all welcomed in the Lord's banquet." This

should fill our hearts with joy as it reminds us every year (if not every Sunday) that no matter what we do, God will always accept us. As long as we just try a little. Some of us have the capability of trying a lot, some of us have the capability of trying very little. You may be the most respected biblical scholar, but if you don't practice your beliefs and have faith, it does not matter how many books you have read. You have to reach the Lord through prayer. feed the soul and let God work through you!

We are here together as one family and we all share from the same cup! We are all one! We welcome new families into our community as Orthodox Christians do best; we embrace each other, we come together, we pray together, we share a meal together. This is the Holy Eucharist, the high point of the Divine Liturgy. Together, this month, let us all embrace each other and love one another.

GREEK SCHOOL NEWS

March 25th - Greek Independence Day Celebration:

This year the Greek School will celebrate Greek Independence Day on Sunday, March 24th, 2013. The celebration will be held after the Divine Liturgy in the Gym. Greek Independence Day - March 25, 1821:

For 368 years, the Greeks were enslaved and suffered under Turkish rule. The people couldn't go where they wanted to go, couldn't speak freely, and didn't have schools for their children to learn Greek. The Turks didn't want the Greek children to learn their language, their religion, and the history of their country. Because of this, at night the children secretly would go to school. These "secret schools" were in churches and most of the teachers were priests. The Turks took property, livestock and whatever the Greeks owned.

On March 25, 1821, the Greeks took weapons to fight the Turks to acquire their freedom. They fought for 8 years. In the end, they won, and gained their freedom. It is on this day, March 25th, we celebrate Greek Independence Day, a national holiday in Greece.




